Mother's Day

John 19:25-27 Now there stood by the cross of Jesus His mother, and His mother's sister, Mary the wife of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus therefore saw His mother, and the disciple standing by, whom He loved, He saith unto His mother, Woman, behold thy son! Then saith He to the disciple, Behold thy mother! And from that hour that disciple took her unto his own home."

This is the time just prior to Jesus' death on the cross. Here Jesus is hanging on the cross, in pain and agony, and look who is standing right there by the cross--His mother! Mary and Jesus portrayed the perfect example of a mother-and-son relationship. Mary stood by His side until the end and while hanging on the cross, Jesus made preparations for His mother to be taken care of after He was gone.

Mothers are a special people! J.R. Bookhoff once said: "Though a mother stays home and keeps her house clean, it is still not a home unless she creates the right spirit in the house. It is the atmosphere created primarily by the mother that makes a home worthwhile." Mothers have many responsibilities that excel that of mere womanhood. Almost anyone can bare a child, but it takes someone special to be a mother to a child!

Mothers also have wisdom, knowledge, and insight that sometimes leaves their children baffled! For instance, did you ever notice that mothers know what you've been into without you telling them? God Will Restore Your Energy

God was not to be found....in the fire of over commitment and busyness that so quickly consumes-but in "gentle stillness." I felt His love and peace surrounded me, and His strength continued to uphold me.

You give of yourself every day to others. In fact, you pour your energy into so many people and details that sometimes you feel tired, even worn out, and your desire for a simpler life appears to be edged aside by others' needs. But don't release your longing for simplicity. Instead, recognize your need for God's presence, where you can find spiritual and emotional renewal. Taking time to be with him and basking in his closeness will restore you so you can give to others again.

Imagine a firefighter running into a burning house without his protective gear. "No time to put it on," he shouts to someone as he disappears into the fiery building. "I have people to save!" Of course, no firefighter would do this-he depends on his gear and oxygen tank; he needs something more than himself to help others. Do you ever, unknowingly, act like this? You may forget that to pour out your love to others, you need something for yourself-time with God. In his presence, you will receive refreshment you could never generate on your own.

How do you enter into his presence? You may want to pray, quieting your voice so you can hear his voice. Sing songs to him or listen to uplifting worship music, remembering that God dwells in the praise of his people. You may experience his renewal as you marvel at his creation: seeing the tiny veins on a newly fallen leaf or feeling the sunshine warm your face. Meditating on scriptures may help you enter God's presence, too.

In time, you'll learn how to experience him as you go about your day. Not that you neglect special private time alone with God-it is food to your soul-but in the quietness of your own heart, you rest with him moment by moment. There, you find a source of renewal that never runs dry-for you are with the giver of life himself.

This is the simpler, less hectic lifestyle you desire-being in the presence of the one who loves you most, who longs to renew your heart and soul.

One Final Thought

When you are renewed in God's presence, you can give to others abundantly.

I often pray, these words, Create in me a clean heart O, God , renew a right spirit within me , take not thy Holy Spirit from me, And see if there be any wicked way in me and lead me in the way everlasting.

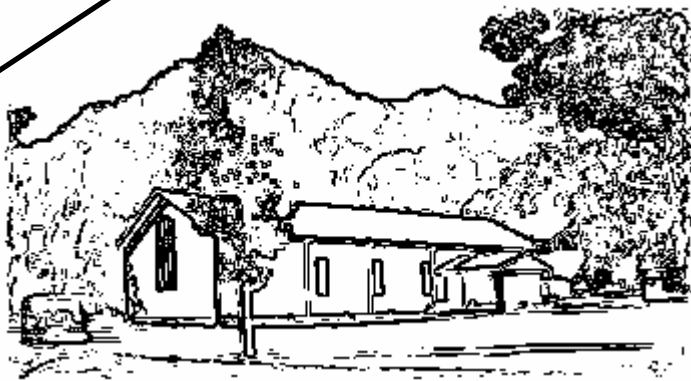
